INTRODUCTION

Luke 11: 1-2

One of the most important rights God gave His Church is prayer. It is the breath of the regenerated Spirit. Except we pray in God's given way, we cannot receive from Him. Knowing how to pray is as vital as the need to pray.

Prayer is communicating or communion with God. The Bible teaches about different types of prayer. Basically prayer is asking God to intervene in a given situation based on His Word. WHY DO WE NEED TO PRAY?

The reason why God made man in His own image is stated clearly in Genesis 1: 26-27 for Him to exercise dominion and rule over all of God's creation. The disobedience of man cost him every blessing and privilege God had given him. Adam lost the dominion to Satan. And in

2 Corinthians 4:4 the Bible states that Satan now becomes the god of this world. The devil now has legal rights to exercise dominion on earth. Matthew 6:10, we ask for the will of God to be done on earth and we become the channels through which God's mercy flows unto the earth. Isaiah 59:16; Isaiah 64:7

Importance Of Prayer

- A. Prayer is the Act of communicating with God. It is the soul of worship and we converse with God during our prayer time. Through prayer we declare our impotence, helplessness and need for God and dependence on Him. 2 Chronicles 20: 1-13

Acts 1:8 we are empowered through prayers to withstand oppositions to the will of God.

Acts 4: 23-33 Elijah confronted the 450 prophets of Baal on Mount Carmel through prayer. He invoked the power and presence of God to deliver Israel from the bondage of witchcraft.

C. Prayer is the main key to heaven's resources.

Jeremiah 33:3 God promises answers and a showing forth of things we do not know about.

Matthew 7:7 encourage us to Ask, Seek, and Knock.

Luke 11:3 give us this day our daily bread.

John 14:13-14; James 4:2

1 Chronicles 4:9 the life and destiny of Jabez was changed after he accessed heaven's resources. He asked God to bless him, enlarge him, touch him and protect him and God answered him.

- D. Through prayer, we partner with God to effect changes on earth.

Matthew 18:18-20 we have the right to bind and loose. God used Jehoshaphat's prayer and the prayer of Judah to thwart the plans of their enemies.

Daniel 2:17 God responded to Daniel's prayer and changed the season of death into a period of life.

 A strong desire when it consumes and overwhelms you, becomes a burden.
- 3. Perseverance and Persistency Luke 18; Ephesians 6:18. We must not get tired, weary, bored or lose heart. Persistent prayer is a continual action and the ability to wait.
- 4. Faith is a needed element and ingredient Hebrew 11:6. Faith in Him and based on His word.
- The word of God. This gives us focus and direction in prayer.
 Jesus in Gethsemany focused on the Father's will
 2 Corinthian 1:20; 1 John 5:14-15
- 6. Recognize and reverence God's presence.
- 7. Confession of Sin (words, thoughts, deeds)
- 8. Specific in our prayer
