

# STUDY 1 — RE SERIES: RENEW YOUR FAITH

## Introduction

Heb 6:1-3 "So let us stop going over the basic teachings about Christ again and again. Let us go on instead and become mature in our understanding. Surely we don't need to start again with the fundamental importance of repenting from evil deeds and placing our faith in God. You don't need further instruction about baptisms, the laying on of hands, the resurrection of the dead, and eternal judgment. And so, God willing, we will move forward to further understanding".

2 Cor 13:5 says "Test to see if your faith is genuine. Examine yourselves to see if your faith is genuine. Test yourselves. Surely you know that Jesus Christ is among you; if not, you have failed the test of genuine faith"

There are three types of faith mentioned in the book of James:

1. D\_\_\_\_\_ Faith

James 2: 17 "So you see, faith by itself isn't enough. Unless it produces good deeds, it is dead and useless"

This refers to intellectual faith. These Christians have the head knowledge. They may be able to quote the passages of Scriptures. They can speak the right vocabulary but their words are not backed up by works. Their walk do not measure up with their talk. They understand the doctrine of salvation but they have never really submitted their lives to the Lordship of Christ. It is a counterfeit faith.

## 2. D\_\_\_\_\_Faith

James 2:19 "You say you have faith, for you believe that there is one God. Good for you! Even the demons believe this, and they tremble in terror. How foolish! Can't you see that faith without good deeds is useless? "

James says even the demons have a measure of faith. They believe in God. They believe in the deity of Christ (Mk 3:11-12). They also believe in hell --the existence of a place of condemnation. In fact, James says because they believe this, they tremble in terror. Demonic faith affects both the intellect and the emotions. So one can give intellect accent to the teaching and even be emotionally moved by it but yet no real change follows.

### 3. D\_\_\_\_\_Faith

Dynamic faith involves the mind, the emotions and the will. Here, James gives two examples of faith i.e. Abraham and Rahab. One is the father of faith, the other is a prostitute. But they both exercised faith. If you read Heb 11, you will soon realise that faith is a verb.

Jn 10:38 "But if I do his work, believe in the evidence of the miraculous works I have done, even if you don't believe me"

# STUDY 2 — RE SERIES: REPENTANCE

## Introduction

Christianity is not about WHAT you become but WHO you become.

### 1. C\_\_\_\_\_ is God's End Game.

Gen 1:26—"Let us make man in our image". Right from the beginning, God spelled out his intention. The Greek word for "character" comes from the idea of creating an imprint on a lump of clay. God desires to imprint his image into our lives.

Rom 8:29 says "...For God knew his people in advance, and he chose them to become like his Son, so that his Son would be the firstborn among many brothers and sisters".

### 2. C\_\_\_\_\_don't determine character

We often concludes that the right circumstances in life could end up with a better life. This may be true physically but not actually true spiritually. In fact, circumstances do not make you, but what does make you is how you respond to the circumstances.

*"Circumstances do not derail you but compromises in the midst circumstances will"—Peter Sutchliff* 

We can see this through some examples in the Bible.

- a. Joseph –tough circumstances. He was sold into slavery by his own siblings, then wrongly accused and ended up in an Egyptian prison—doomed for a lifetime of suffering. But in twenty four hours, Joseph went from a slave-prisoner to be the Prime Minister of the nation. But his journey was marked by the fact that all through his slavery and his prison life he continued to do faithfully what he was able to do.
- b. Daniel--tough job description. Daniel was exiled to Babylon and because he was smart and capable and the favour of God was upon him, he was promoted to be incharged of all the Babylonian religions. He became the head of all the sorcerers and magicians. He did not convert anybody but he conducted himself with integrity. The hallmark of Daniel's character is Dan 1: 8 "But Daniel resolved not to defile himself..."
- c. Moses –tough consequences of failure. He was a promising young man. It was said in the book of Acts that "he was mighty in words and deeds". He was destined. He was a great warrior. He was likely to be the next Pharaoh. Just as he was about to fulfil his destiny—a mistake ensued and he ended up spending forty years in the wilderness with the Israelites. We learned from him that failure is not failure unless we quit.

d. Elisha—his dead bones managed to resurrect someone else.
2 Kings 13:21 "Once while some Israelites were burying a man, suddenly they saw a band of raiders; so they threw the man's body into Elisha's tomb. When the body touched Elisha's bones, the man came to life and stood up on his feet"

1 Cor 15:52-53 "It will happen in a moment, in the blink of an eye, when the last trumpet is blown. For when the trumpet sounds, those who have died will be raised to live forever. And we who are living will also be transformed. For our dying bodies must be transformed into bodies that will never die; our mortal bodies must be transformed into immortal bodies".

2 Cor 5:3 "For we will put on heavenly bodies; we will not be spirits without bodies"


Jesus death on the cross pierced the veil that separated the holy place to the holiest of holy. He did so by submitting his will to the will of the father. For us to be a spirit man, we must learn to submit our will to the will of the Father.

### 3. Obedience is digging down \_\_\_\_\_

Jesus in Matt 7 told a story of two house builders, one was wise and one was foolish. The wise man build his house on the rock and the foolish one build his house on the sand. In the Gospel of Luke, it tells us they were building side by side on the same sort of soil but one dug deeper and hit bedrock whereas the other just build on the surface. Outwardly both houses looked the same but the foundation was revealed when the storms hit, the flood rose and the wind blew.

## STUDY 4 — RE SERIES: RE-CHARGE THE SUPERNATURAL

## Introduction

Acts 1:4-5 Once when he was eating with them, he commanded them, "Do not leave Jerusalem until the Father sends you the gift he promised, as I told you before. John baptized with<sup>[a]</sup> water, but in just a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.

Acts 1:8 "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere—in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth"

Acts 2:1 "When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place..."

As seen in Ps 133:1-2 "How wonderful and pleasant it is when brothers live together in harmony! For harmony is as precious as the anointing oil that was poured over Aaron's head that ran down his beard and onto the border of his robe", unity is so important for the priestly anointing to flow.

Unity in purpose must also be accompanied by obedience. In Gen 11, the people were united in purpose in building the tower of Babel. But they were disobedient. God's intention was for them to go and multiply and filled the earth but they decided to stay on the plain in Babylon.

In Gen 12, God called Abraham to leave his family and go the land that God has shown him but Abraham took Lot together with him.

Gen 13:14-15 says "<u>After Lot had gone</u>, the LORD said to Abram, "Look as far as you can see in every direction—north and south, east and west. I am giving all this land, as far as you can see, to you and your descendants as <u>a permanent possession</u>...<u>Go and walk through the</u> <u>land</u> in every direction, for I am giving it to you."
